Age Scotland's Warm and Well Project



Age Scotland's new Warm and Well project will be delivering information sessions, helping to shine some light on your rights regarding energy. The events will have fun and interactive games to show you how small changes can make big savings on your energy bills.

We will cover:

- Ways to reduce your fuels bills
- Shopping around for the best energy tariff
- Funding and grants to help heat your home
- Eating well and keeping warm
- Having a winter Survival Kit

There are three problems that can lead to people struggling with their fuel bills: high tariffs, inefficient homes and low incomes. This Roadshow will help you how to find out what you are entitled to and help you

tackle these issues.

The sessions will help us find out if you may be eligible for the Warm Homes Discount, Cold Weather Payments and the Winter Fuel Payment. All of which can help reduce large fuel bills during cold winter months.

With rising energy costs and more energy suppliers to choose from than ever, it can be difficult to find the best tariff. These sessions will help you to find out what works best for you.

The Warm and Well Roadshow will be visiting groups of older people in **Aberdeen, Dundee, Edinburgh and Glasgow** until March 2019. Age Scotland Veterans' Project

We've started a three year project to enable Age Scotland, and our member groups, to reach more, and offer more to, armed forces veterans age 65 and older.

The Age Scotland Veterans' Project is part of Unforgotten Forces: a partnership of 15 charities awarded funding from the Aged Veterans Fund. This offers us a fantastic opportunity to strengthen our links with partners including Poppy Scotland, Legion Scotland, Citizens Advice Scotland and the Soldiers, Sailors' and Airmen's Families Association (SSAFA).

The Age Scotland Veterans' Project will promote older veterans' health and well-being by:

- Improving the service that older veterans receive on contacting our helpline: by increasing the veterans' awareness of our helpline advisers, and by referring callers more seamlessly to veterans' organisations and services.
- Informing Age Scotland member groups about issues affecting older veterans, and about their rights and entitlements
- Supporting Age Scotland member groups to include older veterans
- Encouraging older veterans to become involved in Age Scotland member groups
- Taking action to influence public policy and decision-making where we identify opportunities to benefit older veterans.

At this early stage of the project we would like to hear from the following in particular:

- Age Scotland members with a success story to tell about involving older veterans
 - We would like to learn about the ingredients of your success, so we can share them with other member groups
- Age Scotland members that would like to do more to involve older veterans
 - This will help us plan activities to support you to do this, from January 2018 onward.
